Before Elliot came to Young Epilepsy he could not speak. Now he calls me Mum.

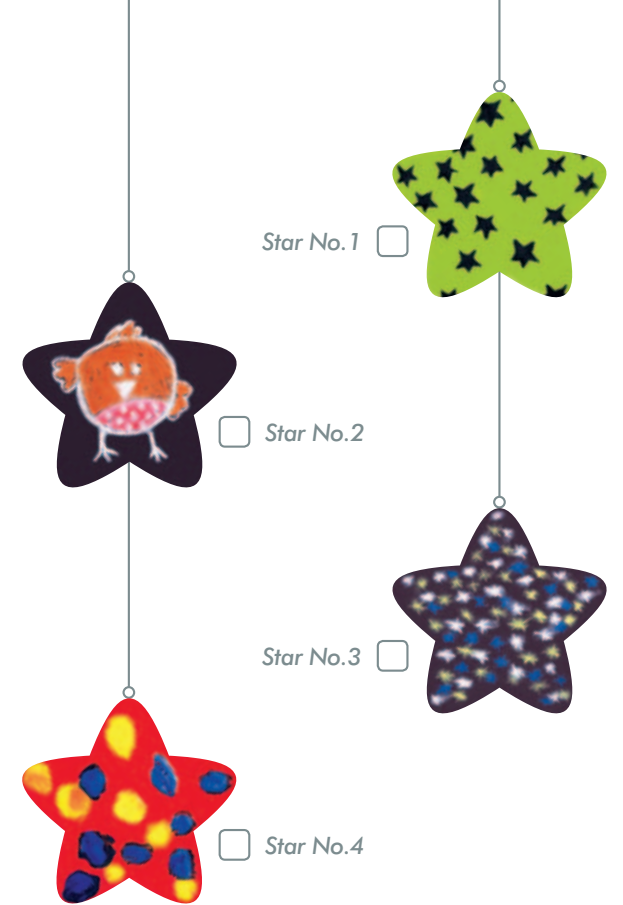
